The scripture that provides insight to the nature of sin is found in Mark 9:38-50. In this passage, Jesus tells us that whoever is not against us is for us! Jesus describes the nature of sin harshly indicating that if our hands, feet, or eyes caused us to stumble, then we should remove them. While Jesus doesn't mean for us to do this literally, he does want us to understand the harshness that will be used to judge our actions. This week, I challenge us to read the bible, pray, and lean into the power of the Holy Spirt to resist sinning!
